10. How is Transition planned and managed by the school?

<u>Transition from nursery to KS1</u>

- o All of the information that is gathered will be shared with parents and the new class teacher.
- o Activities will be planned to allow the best learning to take place.
- o Support staff will help the process ensuring that all of the needs are met within a new class.

Transition from KS1 to KS2

- o All of the information that is gathered will be shared with parents and the new class teacher.
- o Activities will be planned to allow the best learning to take place.
- o Support staff will help the process ensuring that all of the needs are met within a new class.
- o A file of information will be passed from one class teacher to another, so that any recommendations are followed.

Transition from Primary School to Secondary:

- Parents and students of Year 5 and 6 invited to visit the school in September each year:
- o On-going primary visits to school for different activities. These ensue that the primary students begin to be more comfortable and knowledgeable about the school:
- o Information gathered from parents by SEND staff:
- o Talks with the primary schools begin in Year 6, those with an EHC attendance at review by SENCO:
- o Once confirmation of place SENCO liaising with parents and primary school:
