

School Fence



We are delighted that the new fence at the front of school has been completed. One immediate benefit of this is that more doors can be left open in school to provide increased ventilation within classes.

Please be aware that the playgrounds are supervised from 8:30am. Pupils should not arrive unsupervised onto the school site before this time.

All schools within the Tees Valley are supported by the Operation Encompass Scheme. The scheme is operated by Cleveland Police and has been established to safeguard children. If the police are called to any household where there is a domestic incident and a child is present, contact will be made with the child's school the following day. This allows the school to contact the family to see if there is any steps that can be taken to support the child during this time and possible signpost the family to additional services.
