



Mobile Phone Policy



Within school we are consulting on a mobile phone policy which will apply to pupils, staff and visitors, please see attached. The policy sets out the rules for phone use in school. The main points of the policy are:

- The school is a mobile phone free zone. This means that mobile phones are not used by pupils in school, and teachers do not use phones in front of pupils – unless it is for a specific purpose a lap top or PC cannot do.
- School recognise that some parents need their children to have a phone as they could be going somewhere after school. If a pupil needs a mobile phone, it cannot be used in school and **MUST** be handed into the child's class teacher when they arrive at school. The phone will be handed back at the end of the day.
- Any phone brought to school by a child is the responsibility of the child. No liability for loss or damage will be accepted by school.

How We Monitor Attendance

Your child's current attendance is available on the Arbor App.

100–97% – Excellent attendance, keep it up.

96–94% – Below expected standards; parents will receive a letter.

93–90% – Parents may be invited to meet with the Head Teacher to discuss attendance.

90–86% – Significant concern, a pupil with this level attendance is classed as a Persistent Absentee.

85% and below – Serious concern requiring further intervention.
