Breakfast Club



Breakfast Club is going really well, with over 100 pupils attending the session on a daily basis. This means that pupils can get a breakfast of a bagel, cereal, fruit and yoghurt, as well as specials on different days of the week, or just grab a snack before heading outside to play. Teachers have reported that since the start of the free breakfast club, entry to school at 8:45am is calmer and more orderly.

The club starts at 8:00am and last entry is at 8:40am.

Wrap Around Care at New Marske Primary School

As well as breakfast provision, New Marske Primary offers after school care which offers care up to 5:30pm.

In addition to the free breakfast club, we have two paid provisions in school to help support our pupils and parents.

Costs for the wrap around provision are:

Early Breakfast 7:30am – 8am	£1.70 per session
Afterschool wrap around 3:15pm – 5:30pm	£8.00 per session bookable up to 24 hours in advance

The after school club takes part in a range of activities during the week including arts and crafts, baking and computing. Places at the clubs can be booked via Arbor up to 3:15pm the day before, places are payable when you book.
